INTRODUCTION

The British Columbia Chapter of The American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers (ASHVE) received its Charter on April 9, 1952.

The presentation was made by Society President Ernest Szekely to Chapter President M.E. (Eth) Minaker at the Vancouver Quadra Club.

The formation of the Chapter was the result of three years of concerted effort by a team of enthusiasts led by Eth Minaker, Dan Thomson, and Charlie Leek. Achieving the required minimum number of members was the chief stumbling block. Thirty-six members attended the Charter Night Ceremony and celebration.

The Chapter has experienced steady growth from the original 36 members to the present 455. (This last figure includes the Vancouver Island Chapter for comparison purposes).

Over the years, the Charter Members have served the Chapter well - 15 have been Chapter Officers, and 11 have been Chapter Presidents.

Early dinner meetings were held at the Quadra Club, The Pines, The Sands, The Q.E. Theatre Restaurant, Leon's Restaurant, and The Biltmore Hotel. Meals used to be \$2.00 and "refreshments" were 3 for \$1.25. Chapter membership was \$5.00 (or if you joined during the 2nd half of the fiscal year -- \$2.50).

As you read through the following pages, you may understand that we are justly proud of the Chapter's progress and accomplishments during our first thrity-five years.

It is this historian's intention that the Chapter will produce an up-dated history every five years.

FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF THE

British Columbia Chapter

OF

The American Society of Heating and Ventilating Engineers

- 1. This Chapter is established for the purpose of advancing the arts and sciences of heating, ventilating, cooling and air conditioning, and the allied arts and sciences.
- 2. This Chapter shall be governed by the provisions of the Society's Certificate of Incorporation and By-Laws, the Rules promulgated by the Council in harmony therewith, and any amendments to the foregoing.
- 3. Only members of the Society in good standing, residing in the vicinity of this Chapter's headquarters, shall be eligible to become and remain members of this Chapter.
- 4. This Charter is revocable by action of the Council taken pursuant to the Society's By-Laws and Rules.

The 67th ASHRAE Annual Meeting was held at the Hotel Vancouver, June 13-15, 1960. This was a major accomplishment for a fledgling (8 year old) Chapter.

In addition to a wide range of technical subjects and business meetings, the B.C. Chapter offered social programs of impressive proportions. These included a golf tournament, a cruise of the Gulf of Georgia, and sight seeing tours. Activities for the children were a swim party, and a trip to Grouse Mountain Ski Lift.

Some interesting statistics were contained in the ASHRAE Journal, June, 1960. Immediately following the merger with ASRE, total Society membership was approximately 17,500. In the months that followed, there was a gain of nearly 2,000 for a total at June, 1960 of 19,600. There were 88 chapters, a gain of 3 and loss of 1 since the merger.

(Who would believe that Toby Lau was the villain?)

Our meeting place changed to O'Doul's Hotel on Robson St., and this year consisted of topics such as; commissioning buildings, CFC issues, earth energy heat pumps (now referred to as ground source heat pumps?), and residential ventilation. We also had our students present talks on various topics on Student Night.

We held 2 successful seminars, one on Seismic Restraints, and the other one on Firestopping and Smoke Control. Total attendance for the 2 seminars was over 400 people.

The CRC was held in Hawaii, in May 1990. This was a joint CRC between Region X and XI, a tradition which is planned for every 5 years. Our Chapter was well represented with 9 members attending on either a Chapter or Regional level.

This year seemed to mark the start of many discussions and changes in the use of refrigerants and refrigeration technology. The CFC issue came to the forefront, and the Provincial and Federal governments brought forward many rules and regulations on the use and disposal of new and existing refrigerants. In June we held a 1 day seminar on CFC alternatives. (This was originally scheduled as a dinner meeting topic, but it grew so large and important that we decided to change it to a seminar).

This year marked the Chapter's 40th anniversary, and we were honoured to have a visit by Society President-Elect **Dick Charles** and Region XI Chairman **Ralph Mattison** to our February anniversary meeting. Past President **Fraser Wiggins** gave a talk about the history of the Chapter.

Our meeting topics included the Vancouver Island natural gas pipeline, the C-2000 program, cogeneration, and insulation. We also had a presentation on fuel cells from Balllard Power (oh, if we had bought shares then), and learned about the new Boiler & Pressure Vessel act. 
